

RECYCLING ITEMS ACCEPTED BY WASTE INDUSTRIES

Materials do not need to be sorted, but please remove recyclables from plastic bags and throw plastic bags in the trash can. For the safety of those who sort the materials, please rinse all containers and do not put broken glass or hypodermic needles in the bins.

Material	DO NOT INCLUDE:
 <p>Plastic Containers - #1-#7</p>	<p>Plastic bags, plastic clam shells, PVC pipe/tubing, vinyl siding, Styrofoam or polystyrene, plastic medical waste, or plastics that have come into contact with petroleum products and/or hazardous waste</p>
 <p>Aluminum and Steel Cans and Foil</p>	<p>Household items (including toasters, coat hangers, and cooking pots or pans), antifreeze containers, paint cans</p>
 <p>Newspapers, Mixed Paper, and Paperboard</p>	<p>Bagging material or hard cover books. <i>Note: Newsprint can be placed in a Kraft bag.</i></p>
 <p>Magazines, Junk Mail, and Phone Books</p>	<p>Bagging material</p>
 <p>Glass - Brown, Green and Clear</p>	<p>Mirrors, window or auto glass, light bulbs, ceramics, antifreeze containers</p>

Unaccepted materials include: Bagging material (newsprint can be placed in a Kraft bag); mirrors, window or auto glass; light bulbs; ceramics; antifreeze containers; plastic bags; coat hangers; paint cans; household items like toasters, cooking pots or pans; hard cover books (unless the cover is removed); plastic clam shells; PVC pipe/tubing; vinyl siding; Styrofoam or polystyrene (except #6 containers); plastic medical waste; plastics that have come into contact with petroleum products and/or hazardous waste.
